Answers will vary. Strong summaries:

- Accurately state the main idea: attention is treated like a resource in ad-driven platforms.
- Include key points about design choices, behavior changes, and the debate over responsibility and agency.
- Use target vocabulary correctly and in context.

Revision Check: Answers will vary. Revisions should replace vague words with more precise academic language without changing meaning.

Teacher's Guide

- **Objective:** Help Grade 10 students write an academic summary that integrates **discipline-neutral vocabulary** accurately and naturally.
- **How to launch:** Read the first paragraph aloud and model a one-sentence central idea, then show how to select two supporting points without adding opinion.
- **Differentiation:**
 - Support: Provide a summary frame with blanks for central idea and two supports; require three vocabulary words instead of five.
 - On-level: Require five target words and a clear, neutral tone.
 - Challenge: Require seven target words and an additional sentence that captures the counterargument about **agency**.
- **Engagement strategies:**
 - Pair students to check each other's vocabulary accuracy by circling target words and confirming meaning in context.
 - Do a quick class sort of which sentences are "summary" versus "opinion" and revise together.
