Highlighted/Text Evidence Sentences:

- Answer: Dolphins whistle, and each has a special whistle like a name.
 Evidence: "Dolphins also whistle, and each one has a special whistle like a name that identifies them."
- Answer: Dolphins slap their tails on the water to warn others of danger.
 Evidence: "They slap their tails on the water to warn others of danger."
- Answer: Dolphins may leap out of the water to show excitement or send messages.

Evidence: "Sometimes they leap high into the air, which may show excitement or help send messages across the group."

4. **Answer**: Scientists study dolphin behaviors to learn more about communication.

Evidence: "Researchers study these behaviors to learn more about dolphin 'conversations.'"
