Teacher's Guide

- **Using this worksheet**
 - Review the structure of analogies and show students how to read them as "A is to B as C is to D."
 - Model how to identify the relationship in the first pair before solving the second.
 - Encourage students to describe the relationship aloud before writing an answer.
 - Remind students that more than one answer may fit, but it must match the same relationship.
- **Differentiation tips**
 - Provide a word bank for students who need extra support.
 - Offer sentence frames such as "A feather belongs to a bird, so a scale belongs to a..."
 - Allow English learners to draw visual representations of each analogy to strengthen understanding.
- **Engagement ideas**
 - Create a timed class challenge to see how many analogies teams can generate using a given theme.
 - Let students choose one analogy and expand it into a short descriptive paragraph showing the connection.
