Same Word Twice Answer Key

Answers will vary. Responses should show:

- The **same word** used correctly in two different contexts.
- Each sentence clearly supports a **different meaning** of the word.

Sample responses:

- **charge**

Sentence A: The store did not **charge** extra for delivery.

Sentence B: The knight prepared to **charge** toward the enemy.

- **scale**

Sentence A: The fish had a shiny **scale** on its tail.

Sentence B: We need to **scale** the project to fit our time limit.

Teacher's Guide

- **Using this worksheet**
 - Review how **context clues** reveal meaning without using a dictionary.
 - Model one word by brainstorming multiple meanings as a class.
- **Differentiation**
 - Support: Provide a short list of possible meanings for each word.
 - Challenge: Require students to avoid common meanings and use a less familiar one.
- **Extension**
 - Students revise a short paragraph by changing context so a key word shifts meaning.
 - Ask students to collect multi meaning words from science or social studies texts and apply the same process.
