Teacher's Guide

- **Using this worksheet**
 - Remind students that the **sentence clues** matter more than memorized definitions.
 - Model one item by crossing out choices that do not fit the context.
- **Differentiation**
 - Support: Read sentences aloud and pause to discuss clue words as a class.
 - Support: Offer two choices instead of three for students who need scaffolding.
 - Challenge: Ask students to replace the antonym with a stronger or more precise one.
- **Engagement**
 - Have students explain why incorrect options do not work using evidence from the sentence.
 - Turn one sentence into a short role play to show the contrast.
- **Extension**
 - Students write two original sentences showing a word and its antonym using context clues.
 - Create an antonym swap where students exchange sentences and justify their choices.
