Note: Student wording may vary. Responses must correct the vocabulary error accurately.

1. Replace **proved** with **investigated** or **examined**.
Example: The scientist **investigated** a question about plant growth that required more testing.
2. Replace **theme** with **structure** or **organization**.
Example: The author's **structure** included three examples and a concluding sentence.
3. Replace **ecstatic** with **frustrated**, **disappointed**, or **annoyed**.
Example: The coach was **frustrated** when the team forgot its equipment and arrived late to practice.
4. Replace **biased** with **balanced** or **objective**.
Example: The article was **objective** because it included facts from multiple reliable sources.
5. Replace **prediction** with **research** or **confirmation**.
Example: The student made a **confirmation** by looking up the answer in the textbook.
6. Replace **tone** with **instructions** or **procedure**.
Example: The speaker used **instructions** to explain the steps of the experiment.
