

The Future on Four Wheels

Supporters argue that electric cars are the smartest choice for the future of transportation. They believe EVs are cleaner, quieter, and more stylish than traditional gas-powered vehicles. Critics, however, claim that electric cars are still too expensive for most families and that charging stations are inconveniently located.

A single charge on most electric cars today lasts between 150 and 300 miles, depending on the model.
