1. charge

- ELA: an accusation or claim.
- Science: an electric property of matter that can be positive or negative.
- History: an accusation in a legal or public case.
- Connection: a claim or property linked to responsibility or effect.
- Difference: science uses a physical concept; ELA and history use an accusation.

- ELA: refusal or pushback against an idea or change.
- Science: opposition to electric current in a circuit.
- History: organized opposition to control or authority, often a movement.
- Connection: something that pushes back or opposes.
- Difference: science is measurable; history is collective action; ELA is personal reaction.

- ELA: the sequence of events in a story.
- Science: to place data points on a graph.
- History: a secret plan, often to cause harm or seize power.
- Connection: organizing events or points into a planned structure.
- Difference: science is visualizing data; history is secret planning; ELA is story structure.
