Directions: Read both news blurbs below. Each describes the same new city skate park, but from a different perspective. Pay attention to **word choice**, **tone**, and **which details are emphasized or ignored**. Answer the questions to uncover bias and compare viewpoints.

Passage A: Parent's Perspective

The city's decision to build a skate park in the downtown area has caused mixed reactions among parents. Many are worried about safety, pointing to the lack of helmets they see teens wearing. Some fear that loud gatherings at the park could disrupt nearby shops and make the area less family-friendly. While supporters claim the park gives kids a place to go, critics argue that money would have been better spent on educational programs or safer community spaces.

Passage B: Teen's Perspective
