Academic Life Transfer Answer Key

Responses will vary. Check for:

- Accurate use of required vocabulary words in each scenario.
- Clear connection to the scenario and academic setting.
- Complete sentences that maintain logical meaning.

Sample responses:

1. Example: I understand your **perspective**, but I would **contrast** it with another explanation based on the timeline of events. The evidence suggests multiple causes, not just one.
2. Example: We should **analyze** our procedure to see whether measurement error or uncontrolled variables affected the results. After reviewing the data, we can **conclude** whether the hypothesis needs revision or the method needs improvement.
3. Example: A quote can serve as **evidence**, but I need to explain why it is **significant** to the theme. The significance becomes clearer when I connect the quote to the character's choices.
4. Example: I can **justify** my method by showing each step and explaining the rule I used. Then I will **interpret** the final answer in the context of the problem to confirm it makes sense.
5. Example: I will **revise** my claim so it is clearer and more specific. Adding a stronger example can **contribute** to the logic of my argument and make it easier to follow.

Teacher's Guide

- **Purpose:** This worksheet helps students transfer academic vocabulary into real school tasks, strengthening **confidence**, **precision**, and **academic tone** in Grade 9 writing and speaking.
- **Extension ideas:**
 - Have students revise one response to include one more target word without making the sentence awkward.
