Teacher's Guide

- Begin by reviewing the meaning of common roots (geo, bio, micro, etc.).
- Model how combining roots creates new meanings ("photo" + "graph" →
 "light writing").
- Have students explain why each root fits the full word definition.

Differentiation Ideas:

- Grades 4-6: Keep root clues visible and encourage oral discussion of each word's meaning.
- Grades 7-10: Remove the meaning hints and have students infer from context or prior knowledge.
- English Learners: Provide a mini visual chart linking each root to a picture (e.g., a globe for geo, a thermometer for thermo).

Engagement and Extension:

- Encourage students to find one new word with each root during independent reading.
- Turn it into a game: give each group a new "root puzzle" to solve and share with the class.
- For writing practice, have students compose a short paragraph using at least three root-based words correctly in context.
