## **Teacher Notes**

- Emphasize the three "primary" helping verbs (be, have, do) which change forms depending on tense/subject.
- The modals don't change form; this is why they are special.
- Highlight that some forms of "be" and "have" can also serve as main verbs
  (e.g., "I have a book" → main verb, not helping verb). Sorting helps clarify
  when they're functioning as helpers.
- Extension: Ask advanced students to create verb phrases with multiple helping verbs (e.g., She has been working all day).
