Reflection Sample Responses

1. **Difference:** The soldier describes the battlefield and the hardship of marching, while the civilian focuses on fear and survival within her community.
2. **Shared experiences:** Both feel fear, loss, and uncertainty about the future.
3. **Importance:** Studying both gives balance: soldiers show the military struggle, civilians reveal the social and human cost at home.
4. **Fuller picture:** Together, they help us understand war as both a military and civilian experience, deepening empathy and context.

Teacher Note:

Encourage students to see how multiple perspectives prevent history from becoming one-sided. Soldiers and civilians lived the same event, but their priorities and voices reveal different truths. Comparing perspectives builds critical thinking and empathy.
