Thomas Paine's Common Sense (1776, adapted excerpt)

"It is absurd for a continent to be ruled by an island. The distance alone makes governing impossible, for by the time news reaches us from Britain, months have passed. Besides, this land was meant for freedom, not for kings. Britain claims to protect us, but in truth, we are dragged into wars that are not our own. If we must always rely on a power across the sea, we will never prosper as an independent people. The time has come to break away and form a government of our own choosing. Independence is not only possible; it is necessary."
