Revolutionary Reasons Answer Key

- Main message: Colonists should break free from Britain and govern themselves.
- Purpose: To persuade; Paine is urging colonists to support independence, not simply describing facts.
- Reasoning/evidence: He argues that distance makes British rule
 ineffective, Britain's wars harm the colonies, and independence will allow
 prosperity.
- 4. **Emotions/ideas:** He appeals to pride, frustration with unfair rule, and hope for self-determination.
- 5. **Historical influence**: It rallied many colonists toward supporting independence and became a widely read pamphlet shaping revolutionary thought.

Teacher Note:

This exercise helps students distinguish between different author purposes in historical texts. Paine's *Common Sense* is a clear example of persuasive writing with strong emotional and logical appeals. Encourage students to identify both reasoning and rhetorical strategies (like appeals to fairness and freedom).
