# **Sample Responses**

### Teacher's Guide

## **Differentiation Tips:**

- **Grades 3-5**: Provide a list of common homographs for students to choose from (e.g., bat, park, tear, wave, lead).
- **Grades 6-8**: Challenge students to write riddles that could trick peers or include **three clues** per word.
- Grades 9-12: Have students analyze the *part of speech* change in each homograph and rewrite their riddles to include subtle literary clues.

# **Engagement Ideas:**

- Turn it into a "Riddle Swap"—students trade papers and guess each other's homograph answers.
- Host a Homograph Riddle Bee, where students read their riddles aloud and others race to solve them.

### **Extension Activities:**

- Create a Homograph Riddle Booklet illustrated by students.
- Challenge students to include homograph riddles in creative writing projects or classroom bulletin boards titled "Words with a Twist!"
