Sharper Steps Answer Key

Answers will vary. A strong response should show:

- **specific materials** (for example, peanut butter, jelly, two slices of whole wheat bread),
- clear actions (for example, use a butter knife to spread a thin layer),
- **precision** (for example, cut the sandwich into two triangles).

Example revisions:

- 1. Gather two slices of bread, a jar of peanut butter, a jar of jelly, and a butter knife.
- 2. Use the knife to spread a thin layer of peanut butter on one slice of bread and jelly on the other.
- 3. Press the two slices together with the spreads facing each other.
- 4. Use the knife to cut the sandwich into two even halves.

Teacher's Guide

- This worksheet helps students move from **vague** to **precise**, strengthening clarity in how-to and process writing.
- Remind students that good instructions help the reader picture each step clearly.
- For differentiation:
 - Provide a word bank of precise verbs such as spread, measure, slice, stir, gather.
 - Allow students who need support to first describe their step verbally before writing.
 - o Challenge advanced writers to include measurement details or sequencing words.
- For engagement:
 - Let students act out the vague steps to see why they do not work well, then try their improved versions.
 - Allow partners to trade revised steps and evaluate whether each one is clear enough to follow.
- For extension:
 - o Have students revise a full how-to paragraph full of vague steps.
 - o Ask students to create two versions: a simple revision and an extra precise revision with added materials and reasoning.
