### Teacher's Guide

- **Differentiation Tips:**
  - Provide a brief review of analogy types (synonym, antonym, cause/effect, part/whole) before beginning.
  - Offer multiple-choice options for struggling learners to support vocabulary recognition.
  - Challenge advanced students to write two of their own analogies about human rights or equality.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
  - Start with a warm-up: ask students to complete "Freedom is to \_\_\_ as fairness is to \_\_\_" together as a class.
  - Discuss why analogies are powerful tools for expressing complex ideas like justice and empathy.
- **Extension Activities:**
  - Have students turn their favorite analogy into a mini-poster illustrating its meaning.
  - Encourage reflection by asking students to explain how one of their completed analogies connects to Human Rights Day's message of equality for all.
