Sample Reasoning

1. **Freedom of expression** - The right to share opinions is being restricted; the school should allow responsible free speech.
2. **Freedom of association and cultural expression** - The right to share one's culture is being limited; the principal should support inclusion and diversity.
3. **Freedom from discrimination** - The right to safety and respect is being violated; classmates should report and stop the bullying.
4. **Right to fair and safe working conditions** - Workers deserve health and safety protections; authorities should enforce fair labor standards.
5. **Freedom of information and expression** - Citizens have a right to access information and share opinions without censorship.

Teacher's Guide

- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - Offer a list of basic human rights for students to reference during discussion.
 - For struggling readers, read scenarios aloud and discuss before writing.
 - Advanced students can justify their answers with evidence from the *Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR)*.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Begin with a "What Would You Do?" discussion circle to spark empathy and critical thinking.
 - Have students create their own moral dilemmas related to fairness or freedom to share with peers.
- **Extension Activities:**
 - Assign a short reflection essay titled "*Why Doing What's Right Isn't Always Easy.*"
 - Encourage a creative response: design a "Human Rights Hero" comic strip showing someone defending a right in one of the scenarios.
