Sample Response Guide

Topic Example: Promoting Inclusion at School

- **Thesis:** Everyone deserves to feel accepted, and students can make a big difference by promoting inclusion.
- **Body:** Many students feel left out because of their race, background, or beliefs. Starting a "Unity Week" or kindness campaign helps raise awareness and reminds students that equality begins with daily actions.
- **Conclusion:** By showing respect and standing up for others, we help protect the right to be treated with dignity - a human right that starts in our own hallways.

Teacher's Guide

- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - Offer sentence starters (e.g., "One issue that matters to me is...") for struggling writers.
 - Allow students to brainstorm with partners before drafting.
 - Challenge advanced students to include a statistic or quote from the *Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR)*.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Begin class with a short video or quote from a youth activist like Malala Yousafzai.
 - Host a "mini-speech" share session where students present their essays to inspire peers.
- **Extension Activities:**
 - Collect essays to create a digital or printed "Be the Change" booklet for the school library.
 - Encourage students to take real action - such as writing letters, starting a campaign, or volunteering locally - to live out their persuasive message.
