Teacher's Guide

- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - For younger or developing readers, highlight the key years and connect them with visual timeline cues.
 - For advanced students, remove the dates and have them infer sequence based on context clues.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Begin with a quick "Guess the Era" activity using images (e.g., Eleanor Roosevelt, Nelson Mandela).
 - Have students discuss how one milestone might have inspired the next.
- **Extension Activities:**
 - Challenge students to add one more event to the timeline that they believe continues the journey of human rights (e.g., environmental rights, digital privacy).
 - Encourage students to write a reflective paragraph titled "*My Role in Justice Today.*"
