## **Challenge Question (Model Answers)**

- Cause/Effect: Because the heavy rain flooded the streets, the soccer game was canceled.
- Compare/Contrast: Although cats are usually independent, dogs are often more social and eager to please.
- Chronological: First, Maya packed her suitcase, then she grabbed her passport, and finally she headed to the airport.
- **Problem/Solution**: The classroom was too noisy, so the teacher asked everyone to lower their voices.
- **Description**: The old library was quiet and dusty, with tall wooden shelves filled with ancient books.

## **Teacher Notes**

- This activity encourages students to notice signal words and patterns.
- Consider projecting the Sentence Bank and letting students sort in small groups.
- For differentiation:
  - Support: Provide a color-coded signal word list for each structure.
  - o **Extension**: Have students expand sentences into short paragraphs using the same structure.
