Teacher's Guide

• **Skill Focus**: Distinguishing **figurative language** (idioms) from **literal expressions**, building comprehension and metaphorical awareness.

• Differentiation Tips:

- For younger learners, briefly define "idiom" and model one example before students begin.
- For advanced learners, challenge them to explain *why* each correct idiom isn't meant literally.

• Engagement Ideas:

- Play a class game of "Idiom or Not?" where students vote thumbs up (idiom) or thumbs down (literal).
- Encourage students to act out idioms literally and figuratively for classmates to guess.

Extension Activities:

- Have students write two of their own "odd one out" groups using idioms they know.
