- 1. Arrive and begin life in the United States
- 2. Live in the U.S. for a required number of years
- 3. Apply for naturalization
- 4. Learn about American history, government, and English
- 5. Complete an interview and take a citizenship test
- 6. Take the Oath of Allegiance

Check that students demonstrate understanding that the process involves both time and preparation before becoming a citizen.

Teacher's Guide

Purpose: Strengthen sequencing skills while building understanding of naturalization and the citizenship process in U.S. history.

Instructional Tips

- Review key terms: naturalization, Oath of Allegiance, interview, rights, responsibilities
- Use a timeline on the board to show steps visually
