## **Indefinite Substitutes Answer Key**

1. **Someone** knocked on the door, but nobody answered.

(Maria → Someone)

2. I looked in the fridge, but nothing was there.

(the food I wanted  $\rightarrow$  nothing)

3. Everyone needs to bring their homework tomorrow.

(all of the students in the class  $\rightarrow$  everyone)

4. Several stayed late to clean up the gym.

(three of the boys  $\rightarrow$  several)

5. I thought I heard **someone** calling my name in the hallway.

(a person → someone)

6. The teacher asked if **anyone** had a question.

(any of the children  $\rightarrow$  anyone)

7. Both shared the last piece of cake.

(the two sisters  $\rightarrow$  both)

8. Everybody was laughing at the joke.

(every child → everybody)

9. We expected guests, but **nobody** came to the party.

(no friends  $\rightarrow$  nobody)

10. The librarian said that all must be returned by Friday.

(all the books  $\rightarrow$  all)

## **Teacher Notes:**

- This activity strengthens understanding of how **indefinite pronouns can** replace specific nouns for broader or less specific reference.
- Some replacements have multiple valid answers (e.g., "three of the boys"

  → several or few depending on tone).
- Encourage students to explain why their chosen pronoun fits and whether it changes the **meaning or emphasis** of the sentence.
- Extension: Have students create **two original sentences** where they first write specific nouns, then replace them with indefinite pronouns.
