Teacher's Guide

- **Differentiation Tips:**

 - For advanced students, have them rewrite a second excerpt or compare this one to a line from another freedom document.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Let students perform a "Freedom Voices" reading, reciting both the original and their rewritten versions aloud.
 - Create a classroom "Modern Declaration Wall" displaying students' rewritten statements with patriotic borders.
- **Extension Activities:**
 - Challenge students to write one new line they would add to a "21st-Century Declaration of Independence."
 - Encourage reflection: Have them explain in a short paragraph what "freedom" personally means to them today.
