

Excerpt 1: Jacob Riis, How the Other Half Lives (1890)

- 4. Based on this excerpt, what values does Carnegie promote?

Excerpt 3: Ida Tarbell, *The History of the Standard Oil Company* (1904)

"Through secret deals and sudden price cuts, Standard Oil forced competitors to either join them or be wiped from the market. Small businesses had little chance to survive."

- 5. What business practice is Tarbell criticizing in this passage?
- 6. How does Tarbell feel about the effects of Standard Oil's actions? Use wording from the text to support your answer.
