Sample Insertions

Paragraph 1 (Sample)

Yesterday, our class prepared for the science fair. I **myself** designed the poster. The teacher **herself** explained the rules to the group. The students **themselves** organized the tables and set up the displays. The principal **herself** visited and announced the winners.

Paragraph 2 (Sample)

Last weekend, we cleaned the park after the festival. We **ourselves** picked up trash and recycled bottles. The mayor **herself** came to thank the volunteers. The children **themselves** planted flowers near the playground. Even the dog **itself** ran around happily.

Teacher Notes / Guide

- Students don't need to match the answer key word-for-word; any logical,
 correctly used intensive pronoun earns credit.
- Remind students: If the pronoun can be removed without changing the basic meaning, it's **intensive**.
- Encourage students to read both versions aloud to hear the added emphasis.
- Extension: Have students write their own short paragraph and then revise it with intensives for emphasis.
