### Teacher Notes / Guide

- **Skill Targeted:** Students practice distinguishing **past tense vs. past participle forms** of irregular verbs using **context clues**.
- **Case 1 Clarification:** The natural correct form for “Yesterday, I \_\_\_ to the library” is **went**. Since the word options are (go/gone), the intended lesson is to show students why “gone” is wrong. Teachers may pause to discuss why **went** is missing and highlight that irregular verbs often have **three forms**: base, past, and past participle.
- **Teaching Tip:** Remind students to check for *time clues* like “yesterday” (past tense) vs. “has/have” (past participle).
- **Extension Activity:** Have students create their own “mystery sentences” with two choices, then trade with a partner to solve.
- **Differentiation:** Beginners can be given a verb chart first. Advanced students can be challenged with rarer irregulars (e.g., *arise, shrink, shake, forbid*).
