## Background: Trading on the Trail

As the Corps of Discovery traveled west, they often relied on barter with Native tribes to survive. Instead of money, they exchanged useful items such as tools, cloth, and beads. In return, Native people provided necessities like food, horses, and guidance through land that the explorers did not know. Successful trade required respect, communication, and choosing the right item at the right time.
