A Tough Decision at the River

Lewis, Clark, and the Corps of Discovery stood along the edge of a wide, rushing river. The spring snowmelt made the water wild and cold. Their dugout canoes were sturdy, but the strong current could sweep them far off course. William Clark studied the map and pointed to a narrow bend where the river slowed.
