Sample Responses:

1. little patience (negative), a little patience (neutral), the little patience (specific)
2. little hope (negative), a little hope (neutral), the little hope (specific)
3. little time (negative), a little time (neutral), the little time (specific)
4. little effort (negative), a little effort (neutral), the little effort (specific)
5. little progress (negative), a little progress (neutral), the little progress (specific)

Tone explanation examples:

- **Negative:** Suggests scarcity or lack (e.g., "little patience" implies almost none).
- **Neutral:** Suggests a small but positive amount (e.g., "a little progress").
- **Specific:** Focuses on a defined or limited portion (e.g., "the little progress we made").

Teacher's Guide

- **Skill Focus:** Builds awareness of how determiners like **little**, **a little**, and **the little** shift tone and meaning in subtle but powerful ways.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - Provide sentence starters for students needing support (e.g., "There is ___ time left to...").
 - Challenge advanced learners to apply tone shifts in short creative writing pieces.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Turn it into a "Tone Detective" activity where students identify mood changes aloud.
 - Use group discussion to decide which version of each sentence sounds more hopeful or final.
- **Extension Ideas:**
 - Ask students to find examples of each determiner use in a reading passage or online article.
 - Have them write a short dialogue where the same idea is expressed three ways with tone variation.
