### Teacher's Guide

- Review why judicial review was not explicitly stated in the Constitution.

### Differentiation Strategies

- Support: Provide students with a short background summary before the activity.
- Challenge: Ask students to add one additional true/false statement of their own with the correct answer.
- English Learners: Use vocabulary visuals (judge, court, Constitution) and provide sentence starters.
