Teacher's Guide

- Begin by introducing each term with examples from students' daily lives (e.g., "protest" can mean standing up for fairness at school).

Differentiation:

- *Advanced:* Ask students to group related words (e.g., "equality," "justice," and "freedom") and explain their connections.

Extension Ideas:
