## **Dream Builders Answer Key**

Student responses will vary, but strong answers should:

- Describe a **specific dream or goal** that helps others or improves the world.
- Show inspiration from Dr. King's message of peace, fairness, or equality.
- Include a realistic action step the student could take today or in the near future.
- Use **complete sentences** and show clear effort in expression.

## Teacher's Guide

- Begin with a quick discussion about Dr. King's "I Have a Dream" speech.
- Have students brainstorm on the board examples of real-world "dreams" for change.
- Encourage use of sensory words or emotional language to make writing vivid.

## Differentiation:

- Grades 3-4: Provide a sentence starter ("My dream is to...").
- Grades 5-6: Challenge students to include a quote or a short reflection on Dr. King's legacy.
- Advanced: Ask students to compare their dream to one of Dr. King's ideas.
