

Dr. King's Life And Legacy Answer Key

Teacher's Guide

Differentiation:

- *Grades 6-8:* Ask students to cite evidence from the passage in their answers.
- *Advanced:* Have students compare Dr. King's ideas to another historical figure who fought for justice.

Extension Ideas:

- Ask students to research another Civil Rights event connected to Dr. King and summarize it in a paragraph.
- Encourage students to write a modern "I Have a Dream" statement that connects to current social issues.
