Strong responses should include:

- **Persuasive language** using emotional or logical appeal (e.g., "Everyone deserves respect" or "Our voices together can change things").
- Complete sentences forming a well-organized paragraph.

Teacher's Guide

- Start with a class brainstorm of what equality looks like today (e.g., gender fairness, inclusion, equal opportunities).
- Review persuasive writing structure: topic sentence, supporting details, conclusion.
- Model one or two sentences aloud using powerful, emotion-driven vocabulary.

Differentiation:
