Possible Revisions with Stronger Adjectives:

1. The **golden** morning sun rose over the **sleepy** town.
2. The **spirited** band played a **joyful** tune.
3. Veterans marched with **fearless** faces and **confident** steps.
4. Children waved **tiny** flags and clapped with **cheerful** smiles.
5. The **haunting** sound of a trumpet ended the parade.

(Answers may vary; students' creativity should be encouraged.)

Quick Tips for Differentiation:

- **Grades 3-4:** Provide a list of vivid adjectives for students to choose from.
- **Grade 5:** Challenge students to replace two adjectives in each sentence with completely original ones.
- **Advanced students:** Ask them to explain how their new adjectives change the tone or imagery.

Engagement Ideas:

- Have students share their rewritten sentences aloud and vote on the most vivid version.
- Use a "**Patriotic Word Wall**" featuring powerful adjectives like "heroic," "valiant," "radiant," and "courageous."
- Let students illustrate one rewritten sentence to show the image their adjectives create.

Extension Ideas:

- Write a short poem or paragraph using at least five new adjectives learned from this activity.
- Encourage students to find adjectives in other patriotic songs or poems (like "America the Beautiful").
- Combine all student sentences into a **class poem** titled "**Our Parade of Freedom.**"
