Teacher's Guide

- Provide a quick mini-history talk about why the North and South disagreed.
- Model how to look for clues in each statement such as keywords "slavery," "economy," "power," or "fairness."

Differentiation

- Read statements aloud for learners needing decoding support.
- For emerging writers, offer N/S abbreviations as an option.
- Challenge advanced students to create one original statement for each side.

Engagement Ideas

- Use two sides of the room labeled "Northern" and "Southern" and let students move to the correct side for each statement.
- Allow students to justify their choices in pairs for speaking and listening practice.

Extension Activities

- Make a T-chart in notebooks to write additional examples of each region's viewpoints.
- Connect to later compromises and conflicts between free and slave states for deeper understanding.
