Sample Answers to Reflection Questions

- **1.** I think the myth that "Al is always neutral and fair" causes the most harm. If people believe this, they won't question Al systems that are actually biased, like hiring tools or policing software. This could make unfair treatment worse instead of fixing it.
- **2.** I think the issue "People may over-trust AI results and not double-check important decisions" is the most dangerous. If doctors, judges, or financial workers trust AI without checking it, a single mistake could hurt a lot of people. Humans still need to make final decisions, not just machines.
