- o No opinion or emotional commentary.
- o Third person point of view with clear reporting language such as stated, reported, confirmed.

Sample guiding differences:

- Diary: "I felt exhausted but proud as we lifted the broken boards."
- Report: "Volunteers worked throughout the day to clear debris and provide temporary repairs."

Teacher's Guide

- Explain the difference between **personal voice** and **neutral reporting**, highlighting how tone depends on purpose and audience.
- Model short examples to show how point of view and tone shift meaning.

Differentiation tips:

- Provide sentence starters for both forms, such as "Today I..." for diaries and "According to local officials..." for reports.

Engagement ideas:
