

Mix And Match Adventure Answer Key

Teachers should look for:

- A correctly combined character and setting that match one from each list.
- A narrative that uses both chosen elements clearly.
- A story with simple sequence and clear action appropriate for Grades 2 to 4.
- Sentences that show effort in organization and detail.

There are no single correct answers. The focus is on correct use of the mixed prompt and basic narrative structure.

Teacher's Guide

Purpose: This worksheet helps students practice flexible, imaginative storytelling by combining characters and settings. It strengthens narrative structure and creativity.

How to Support Students:

- Read the lists aloud and ask students to picture each character and setting.
- Model how to combine one character with one setting to form a simple prompt.
- Encourage students to plan before writing by saying their story aloud.

Differentiation Tips:

- For emerging writers: Reduce choices to two characters and two settings.
- For developing writers: Ask them to include a beginning, a problem, and a solution.
- Provide a word bank with helpful words like **bridge, forest, robot, market, help, search, lost, brave.**

Engagement Ideas:

- Let students draw their character in the setting before writing.
- Give students small paper cards to mix and match physically.
- Hold a quick class poll on the funniest or most unexpected character and setting pairing.
