Teacher's Guide

- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - Review both unification timelines before the activity so students can connect events with the correct country.
 - Allow students needing support to underline key words like *Prussia*, *Garibaldi*, or *Cavour* for clues.
 - Have advanced learners add short explanations beside each answer explaining why they chose that country.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Turn the worksheet into a "**Nation Showdown**" quiz game: students compete in teams to answer quickly.
 - Read clues aloud and have students stand on one side of the room for Italy, the other for Germany.
 - Play "Who Am I?"-students draw leader cards (Bismarck, Cavour, Garibaldi) and act out their roles for classmates to guess the country.
- **Extension Activities:**
 - Ask students to create one new clue for each country to challenge their classmates.
 - Encourage writing a short paragraph comparing Italy's diplomatic unification to Germany's military strategy.
 - Assign a reflection: "*Which nation's path to unification do you think was more difficult, and why?*"
