## North American Migration Answer Key

### Teacher's Guide

### Instruction Tips

- Review key vocabulary such as migration, climate challenges, and communities.
- Encourage annotation during reading to identify reasons for migration in different time periods.
- Model how to cite examples from the text when answering analysis questions.

### Differentiation

- Provide writing frames for students who need structured reflection support.
- Offer small group discussion before writing for students who benefit from verbal processing.
- Challenge advanced learners to compare North American migration with migration patterns in another region.

### Engagement Ideas

- Begin with a class brainstorm on reasons people move from one place to another.
- Invite students to share examples of migration stories they have learned about from family or history classes.
