Teacher's Guide

- **Quick use:** Read one box aloud first, then ask students to tell you which words "sound the same at the end" before they circle.
- **Differentiation:**
 - Support: Highlight one rhyming word and have students hunt for its partner; allow picture cues or whisper-read together.
 - Challenge: Have students add one more rhyming word orally for each rhyme set (example: wall, fall, call).
- **Engagement tips:**
 - Use a "rhyme clap" routine: clap on the rhyming words as you read.
 - Let students use a crayon to circle rhymes and a pencil to underline the ending sound they hear.
- **Extension ideas:**
 - Rhyme sort: Write circled words on cards and sort by ending sound.
 - Make-your-own line: Students pick one rhyming pair from a box and create a silly new sentence using both words.
