### Teacher's Guide

- Discuss the three climate zones before beginning to ensure students understand each type.

### Differentiation Tips

- Provide short definition cards of each climate zone for students who need support.
- Pair students strategically so those with stronger comprehension can assist others.
- Challenge advanced learners to explain how climate zones influence the types of plants and animals found in Oceania.

### Engagement Ideas

- Show a map highlighting climate regions of Australia, New Zealand, and nearby Pacific islands.

### Extension Activities
