Teacher's Guide

- **Focus Skill:** Understanding **opposites and contrasts** helps students strengthen vocabulary and recognize relationships between words.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - For younger learners, use picture cards to support word meaning (e.g., show "hot" and "cold" with images).
 - For advanced learners, encourage them to find **antonyms** with multiple possible answers (e.g., "big" → "small," "tiny," or "little").
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Play "Opposite Toss": one student says a word while tossing a soft ball, and the catcher must say its opposite.
 - Create an "Opposite Wall" in the classroom where students post word pairs they discover in their reading.
- **Extension Activities:**
 - Have students write a short paragraph using at least three pairs of opposites.
 - Let older students explore **contrast words** in context (e.g., "but," "however," "although") to deepen their understanding of language contrast.
