## **Human Activity on the Pacific**

The Pacific Ocean connects many coastal regions that depend on it for work, travel, and resources. **Tourism** brings visitors to beaches, coral reefs, and island cultures. This can support local businesses but may also put pressure on the environment through pollution or overcrowding. **Fishing** provides food and jobs for millions, but overfishing can damage ecosystems and reduce wildlife populations. **Trade routes** stretch across the Pacific, allowing ships to carry goods between Asia, Oceania, and the Americas. These routes help economies grow but can increase risks such as oil spills, coastal traffic, and habitat disruption.

Understanding how human activity shapes the Pacific is important for protecting both people and the environment.

- 2. Why is overfishing a concern for Pacific ecosystems?
- 3. How do Pacific trade routes support the economies of countries around the ocean?
- 4. What is one environmental risk linked to increased ship traffic?
