Teacher Notes / Guide

- This passage demonstrates how past continuous paints the background of historical events, while simple past (e.g., "the lights went out") shows sudden, interrupting actions.
- Students should notice the contrast between ongoing actions (were sitting, were cooking) and the big event (the blackout).
- Encourage students to underline all the was/were + verb-ing forms in the passage before answering.
- Extension idea: Have students choose another historical moment (e.g., during a storm, at the start of a war, or a famous invention day) and write
 4-5 sentences describing what people were doing at that time.
