- 2. The children were playing soccer... \rightarrow F. when the ball broke a window.
- 3. She was cooking dinner... \rightarrow E. when the oven timer rang.
- 4. They were watching a movie... \rightarrow **A**. when the power went out.
- 5. We were studying for the test... \rightarrow **D**. when the lights suddenly turned off.
- 6. My dad was fixing the car... \rightarrow H. when he dropped his tools.
- The teacher was explaining the lesson... → B. when the principal entered the classroom.
- 8. The dog was barking loudly... \rightarrow **G. when a stranger knocked on the door**.

Teacher Notes / Guide

- This activity highlights the classic interrupted action pattern:
 - → Past continuous = background action
 - → Simple past = sudden event
- Students should first underline the was/were + verb-ing parts in Column A.
- Matching encourages comprehension of logical cause-and-effect rather than rote memorization.
- Extension idea: After matching, have students combine the pairs into full sentences (e.g., I was walking to school when the bus splashed water on me.).
